History

First released in 1979, the Gold Canadian Maple Leaf coin has become one of the most desirable bullion coins in the world today. The front of the coin features a maple leaf, the national symbol of Canada for which the coin derives its name. The reverse depicts Queen Elizabeth II to represent the constitutional monarch of the Commonwealth realms and the governor of the Church of England.

Production: Royal Canadian Mint

Produced by the Royal Canadian Mint, this coin originally contained .999 (99.9%) fine gold until 1982, when the amount of gold per bullion increased to 24 karats at .9999 (99.99%) purity. This coin is currently the purest gold coin in the market. In minting, the coin first gets melted and transformed into a continuous strip. The size, weight, thickness and edges go through a rigorous inspection process focused on perfection. As an extra layer of protection, any coins made in 2015 and after contain a micro-engraving security feature to ensure that no replicas are being made. Due to this, the Gold Canadian Maple Leaf bullion coin has become one of the most recognizable coins in the world.
